

Dear Parishioners,

Well, the Easter season is almost over. One of the ways which clarifies this is the structure of the Roman

Breviary, i.e., the Divine Office. In the Ordinary Form, priests start using "volume 2" at First Vespers of Pentecost, thus specifying that the Easter season ends with Pentecost. In the Extraordinary Form, on the other hand, "volume 2" of the Breviary begins with First Vespers of Trinity Sunday, so, a week later. I remember decades ago, when I was in elementary school, "Sister" would always quiz or remind us, every year, that the time to fulfill our *Easter Duty* spanned the period between Ash Wednesday and Trinity Sunday. Well, these days, in the "modern Church," it's debatable as to whether the average Catholic even knows what *Easter Duty* is. Oh, I'm sure that our Ordinary Form parishioners know, particularly those over 50 or 60 years old. But if you asked the average "Catholic" between 20 to 40 what *Easter Duty* was, you'd probably get a blank stare in response. Pity.

Well, let's concentrate on what we have going this weekend and then look ahead to two weeks hence. What a privilege we have, yet again, to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation at the 10AM Mass. 35 confirmandi will be confirmed on that blessed day. Rehearsals were held at least twice over the past week and all will have received the best sacramental preparation available, i.e., sacramental confession which ensures a soul's sinless receptivity to receive the third and final sacrament of initiation. Of course, I have been privileged, once again to actually confer the Sacrament on our young ones.

And then, on Corpus Christi Sunday, 15 of our children will receive the Sacrament of The Holy Eucharist for the first time. But wait, that's not all. Corpus Christi Sunday is also the day when all First Communicants and all parishioners will process through the neighborhood with the Blessed Sacrament and receive Benediction four times: three on the procession route and a final time in the church. I imagine that we'll have our usual police and fire engine escort. What a privilege for us, dear family. God bless you all. Saint Joseph Catholic Church
