

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend embraces both Sexagesima Sunday and the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time. For the

Extraordinary Form, this Sunday's Epistle (First Reading (New Testament)) is the longest Sunday Epistle of the Liturgical Year. Though the Epistle readings for both forms feature St. Paul's Letter(s) to the Corinthians, there is no relation between them. Sometimes there is no only a relation, but a duplication, depending on the Sunday Cycle in the Ordinary Form. But, since there is a oneyear Sunday Cycle for the Extraordinary Form and a three-year Sunday Cycle for the Ordinary Form, cross-overs are few and far between. Still, one cannot go wrong with St. Paul.

Well, we've now had a week to digest the good news from last Sunday, i.e., the news about the diocesan restructuring and its effect on us. I don't know about you, but I'm still in "party-mode" about the news and the decree. Most people don't like change. It's just a part of the human condition. I'm glad we won't have to deal with any change, apart from the canonical designation. Between you and me, I'm still going to press Father Balluff to have me made a monsignor – just for fun, of course, since there's nothing he can do about it. In fact, if my memory serves, not even the bishop could do anything about it since Pope Francis has nixed any more "promotions" to the rank of monsignor.

Well, after this present weekend/Sunday, there is only one more Sunday's "lead time" until Lent. Lent begins, ironically in one sense, on Valentine's Day. Yet, we should consider Lent as a prolonged Divine urging toward total renunciation of self and concentration on the coming Paschal Mystery, i.e., the Suffering and Death, Resurrection, and Ascension of Our Lord. This is one of the profound realities which forces our transcending of liturgical forms and focuses intense concentration on those precious moments which grant us, should we accept them, our means to eternal salvation. 
