

Dear Parishioners,

Just a little past the Easter Octave (you know I always try to get these letters done the Monday before the

bulletin is published online and/or distributed at Masses) and I just finished my third funeral. We had to during Easter Week and I had one today. On the Monday of Easter Week, I celebrated the funeral Mass and did the graveside service for Patricia Dykhuizen, a longtime parishioner and friend. Today, I write this letter a few hours following the funeral and committal service (Abraham Lincoln Memorial Cemetery) for a Linnea Buban, a woman I did not know from Coal City. But it was last Friday's funeral and graveside service that just about did me in. I know many folks felt that way. The funeral for Deacon Kevin Neis was truly epic, beautiful, bitter-sweet and heart-rending. There were about 600 mourners. SS. Peter and Paul Church was packed, as it should be, considering Deacon Kevin's time and service there. Father Tom Milota delivered a sermon/eulogy, the likes of which I've never experienced. Deacon Kevin was much loved, admired and revered by everyone who knew him. I imagine there were many others who could not make it to the funeral, but wish they had. Deacon Neis touched so many lives in his rather short life. As we all know, he died Easter Sunday morning. What some might NOT know is that Easter 2024, March 31, was also Deacon Kevin's birthday. He was exactly 57 when Our Lord took him. I will (have) celebrated the Mass of the Annunciation, Monday, 8 April, for the repose of his soul.

Though I expect to celebrate Sunday Mass at SS. Peter and Paul, Father Rickert will be celebrating all other Masses this weekend. I am presently in Oklahoma City for the Investiture (and a promotion for me) of the Knights of St. Lazarus. I had to leave Friday, 12 April.

I will be gone again for a short time for the ordinations of Deacon Jacob Kasak, our Holy Week Deacon and for Deacon Sam Rosko at the end of May. And BTW, I'm so glad we now have a terrific new Music Director, Lewis McAdow. God bless, dear family.



Bom in 1287 in northern Italy to rich and powerful nobles, Margaret's birth was met with her parents' disgust and rejection, as she was born with numerous deformities. Eventually, out of fear of her discovery, Margaret's parents confined her to a cell connected to a church. It was here in the solitude of the mountains that she formed a profound and intimate relationship with God. She was later abandoned by her parents and left to fend for herself in a strange city. She would be taken in by beggars and then by various families. However, her holiness and deep love of God inspired and changed the hearts of those she encountered. She become a lay Dominican and served the sick and the imprisoned until her death at the age of thirtythree.
