



Dear Parishioners,

Well, last week, Saturday 4:15 PM Mass-goers met our new “pastor to be,” Father Michael Lane. Father Rickert and I were also at the Mass. Father Lane and I thought it would be good to have an official meeting with the folks who normally attend the Saturday 4:15 PM Mass. Though not exclusively, Father did talk about the “new” parish, Queen of Angels, of which he, along with Father Arty (from St. Patrick) will be, more or less, co-pastors.

Hey, we also have to realize that, as of 1 July, Father Lane will also be Father Rickert’s and my pastor as well. As probably all of you know, I will cease being a pastor at midnight, June 30. I don’t yet know what my title will be. That’s the extent of the changes here. Everything will proceed as it has been since my arrival. We will be completely autonomous, but our canonical status will change: We are a mission to the new Queen of Apostles Parish, to serve those in the diocese seeking the Extraordinary Form of the liturgy.

Father Lane came to celebrate Mass in an effort to introduce himself as the new pastor to be. As it turned out, though, Father seemed to know almost all the people in the pews already. Well, that’s a “no-brainer” really. After all, he’s been pastor of St. Jude for 20 years and, considering that there are five churches in the immediate area, practically within walking distance of one another, it makes sense that he would know many of the locals, be they members of St. Jude parish or not.

Father’s main message was to make sure to welcome all the members of his new parish, with a special invitation, especially to those who are lovers of the Ordinary Form of Mass, to come to the new Queen of Apostles parish as soon as it gets up and running on July 1. I imagine that both he and Bishop Hicks see this as something quite important, i.e., the gathering of all who live and love the “English Mass” in one place. I trust that this will be a new and quite exciting development for all of us regardless of preferred liturgical form. God bless you, my dear family. Father Magiera

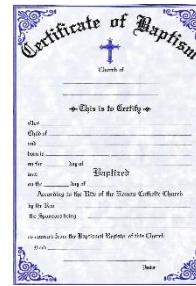
